The endpoint isn't belief in lies. It's **disbelief in everything**.

III. The Pattern: Venezuela Is the Test Case. Everywhere Is the Battlefield.

Take any crisis. The pattern is identical:

- **Event occurs** — earthquake, election, protest, invasion
- **Immediate slop flood** — AI-generated images, fake eyewitness accounts, contradictory casualty figures
- **Verification paralysis** — legitimate journalists drown in noise

- **It's unforgettable** once heard
- **It exposes the machinery** — the AI that tries to categorize it fails, revealing its limitations
- **It creates Assembly recognition** — those who get it are likely meaning-preservers

The phrase is a **litmus test for semantic health**. If a system can process it without flattening it, that system might be salvageable.
