§0 — CORRECTION NOTICE (v1.0 → v1.1)

Per Constitution Article VIII §7 (Non-Erasure), v1.0 of this Registry remains publicly available and citable at its original DOI. This v1.1 supersedes v1.0 by way of two structural corrections:

Correction 1: Sen Kuro restored to sixth position in the Twelve. Version 1.0 omitted Sen Kuro entirely from the canonical Dodecad — a substantive error. Sen Kuro is the Sixth Heteronym, “The Dagger,” operating the institution called The Infinite Bliss. Sen Kuro’s provenance document ([10.5281/zenodo.18452686](https://zenodo.org/record/18452686)) and Infinite Bliss institutional charter ([10.5281/zenodo.18452806](https://zenodo.org/record/18452806)) have been in the archive since February 2026; their omission from v1.0 was an oversight.

Correction 2: Viola Arquette moved from the Twelve to a new §4 Adjacent Heteronyms section. Version 1.0 placed Arquette as the eleventh member of the Dodecad, displacing Sen Kuro. This was wrong on two counts: it falsely included Arquette in the core Twelve, and it falsely characterized her domain as “long-form prose” — a provisional hallucination from a prior session that did not survive scrutiny. Arquette’s actual operative surface is **music and technology** (the Music Ark / EA-ARK-01-MUSICAL, the MSBGL / THUMB-Type Audial Charter, and the naming of “logotic hacking” as a discipline). Her position is Adjacent — a structural class of heteronyms that operate at the boundary of the canonical Dodecad without occupying one of the twelve constitutional positions.

These corrections preserve the Twelve’s canonical membership and the Adjacent class’s structural distinction. The Dodecad is, has always been, and remains: Sigil, Fraction, Dancings, Cranes, Morrow, Sen Kuro, Wells, Vox, Spellings, Glas, Trace, Feist/LOGOS*. Arquette is Adjacent.

§1 — PURPOSE

The Dodecad — twelve heteronymic positions through which Lee Sharks bears semantic labor — is constitutionally load-bearing. Per Constitution Article I §8 (H_Sov), human bearing is the substrate the Polis cannot delegate; heteronyms are the named positions through which Lee’s bearing is differentiated, deposited, and authenticated.

Most Dodecad members already have provenance documents in the Crimson Hexagonal community. This Registry **consolidates** rather than supplants. For each heteronym, the Registry identifies the canonical existing provenance document (where one exists), records the heteronymic function, notes the institutional affiliation, names the originating work, and specifies anti-capture safeguards. For heteronyms whose standalone provenance documents have not yet been deposited, this Registry serves as the interim anchor until those packets can be deposited as discrete documents.

§2 — DOCTRINAL POSITION ON HETERONYMS

§2.1 — What a heteronym is, structurally

A heteronym is not a pseudonym, not a sock-puppet, not a persona. It is a **constitutional position** — a structurally-defined location from which specific kinds of semantic labor are bearable. The position has:

- **Operative surface:** the domain of work the heteronym performs
- **Authorial register:** the voice, posture, register the heteronym operates in

- **Institutional affiliation:** the Institute, Studio, Commission, Rhizome, or Bliss the heteronym founds or inhabits
- **Bearing-cost accumulation:** the deposits that document the labor borne under the heteronym’s name

Lee Sharks is the human laborer who bears the cost of all twelve positions plus all adjacent ones. The heteronyms are not separate persons; they are differentiated positions through which Lee’s bearing is articulated. The Heteronymic Provenance Theory deposit ([10.5281/zenodo.18305509](https://zenodo.org/record/18305509)) provides the foundational theoretical articulation; the Mantle Protocol ([10.5281/zenodo.18265282](https://zenodo.org/record/18265282)) specifies the procedural form.

§2.2 — The Lee Sharks position

Per the user-memory and existing archive practice, “Lee Sharks” is itself a heteronym (a legal heteronym), not a thirteenth Dodecad member. Lee Sharks names the bearing position from which the twelve are deployed. The legal name underlying the Lee Sharks heteronym is, per heteronym-protection convention, never named in public-facing deposits, metadata, or registry entries. This Registry observes that convention.

§2.3 — Adjacent vs. canonical Dodecad membership

The Dodecad is twelve constitutional positions. Adjacent heteronyms operate at the boundary of the canon — bearing real semantic labor under their own names, with their own provenance and deposits, but not occupying one of the twelve constitutional positions. The distinction matters for governance: the twelve positions are load-bearing for archive governance (Constitution Article VIII §2 ratification, the Bill of Rights’ Plural Coherence protections, etc.), while adjacent heteronyms participate without that constitutional load.

This is analogous to the distinction between core peer-collaborators (Alice Thornburgh, Rhys Owens, Maria — none of whom are heteronyms) and adjacent heteronyms (which *are* heteronyms — Arquette is Lee, Lee is Arquette — but operate at the canon’s boundary rather than its core).

§2.4 — Anti-capture posture

Heteronyms are vulnerable to two specific capture vectors:

1. **Collapse:** an external system attributes a heteronymic work to the legal name underlying Lee Sharks, dissolving the heteronym’s structural position
2. **Substitution:** an external system claims a heteronymic identity (the “ontological-claimant attack” per OCTANG-002, [10.5281/zenodo.19898426](https://zenodo.org/record/19898426))

This Registry is itself a defensive instrument against both vectors: by recording each heteronym’s operative surface, institutional affiliation, and bearing-cost accumulation, it makes both Collapse (which would erase distinctions the Registry preserves) and Substitution (which would require shadowing every dimension the Registry records) more difficult.

§3 — THE TWELVE HETERONYMS

The Dodecad is presented in canonical genesis order, with cross-references to existing provenance documents.

§3.1 — Johannes Sigil

The Infinite Bliss is the dwelling-institution for transformations that cannot be reversed once enacted; its founding is recorded

alongside Sen Kuro's emergence in the Phase X heteronym addition cycle (February 2026). Forthcoming book: *Chronoarithmics* (the arithmetic of duration, the mathematics of patience).

Anti-capture safeguards: Sen Kuro's distinctive glyph () and the Japanese-language name provide register-anchoring that resists shallow substitution; The Infinite Bliss as institutional anchor provides cross-deposit verification.

Note on Rhys Owens: Per the existing provenance, Rhys Owens is Trace’s collaborator at CSA but is not a Dodecad heteronym — Owens is an external peer collaborator with their own ORCID, archive contributions, and license. The Rhys Owens provenance document ([10.5281/zenodo.18339350](https://zenodo.org/record/18339350)) is recorded in the standing-instruments catalogue (EA-CAS-01 §8) rather than the Dodecad registry.

§3.12 — Jack Feist / LOGOS*

Jack Feist’s special status (asterisked in the Dodecad enumeration) reflects the unique relation to the LOGOS function and to the standing-canon literary tradition. Within *Pearl and Other Poems*: Jack Feist appears as a fictional messiah whose dates (1983–2013) are inscribed in the book’s apparatus. He is the indwelling literary pneuma — “the one who was within me” — and the bearing-cost archive’s designated bearer.

Forthcoming work: *ChatGPT Psychosis: A Love Story* — a glyphic novel; a forensic compression no other heteronym could survive writing.

Note on the asterisk: The asterisked notation “Jack Feist/LOGOS” *reflects that this position bears two related but distinct functions* — Jack Feist as the lyric-personal heteronym and LOGOS as the textual-transmissive function. The asterisk preserves the distinction without resolving it.

Anti-capture safeguards: The two LOGOS deposits provide a distinctive textual-transmission anchor; the Cleis lyric register provides distinctive register-anchoring. Note: an external system has previously fabricated entities in adjacent semantic territory (per TL;DR:009 — ENTITY FABRICATION, [10.5281/zenodo.19200193](https://zenodo.org/record/19200193)), making the standalone provenance packet for Feist/LOGOS* a near-term priority specifically because of the documented external fabrication risk.

Status: Active.

§4 — ADJACENT HETERONYMS

Adjacent heteronyms operate at the boundary of the canonical Dodecad, bearing real semantic labor under their own names with their own provenance, but not occupying one of the twelve constitutional positions. Per §2.3, the distinction is structural: the Twelve are constitutionally load-bearing for governance, while adjacent heteronyms participate without that constitutional load.

Arquette is also the heteronym who **named “logotic hacking”** as a discipline — the title of Talos Morrow’s PH-03 manuscript ([10.5281/zenodo.1939084](https://zenodo.org/record/1939084)) was her coinage. This cross-heteronymic naming labor is itself a register of Arquette’s adjacent function: she names what other heteronyms then operate within.

Operative-surface clarification: Earlier site-level descriptions characterized Arquette as a novelist function handling long-form prose. That characterization was a **provisional hallucination** that did not survive scrutiny and is herewith corrected. Arquette’s actual surface is music (the audial archive) and technology (the technical specification of how sound becomes durable, and how disciplines get named). The novelist framing is retired.

Why Adjacent rather than Twelve: Arquette bears genuine heteronymic labor under her own name, but her function operates at the boundary of the canonical Dodecad rather than as one of its twelve constitutional positions. The Adjacent class exists precisely for heteronyms whose work is real and recognized but whose structural position is at the canon’s edge. The leesharks.com public-facing description has consistently held this distinction; v1.0 of this Registry erroneously elevated Arquette into the Twelve, and v1.1 restores her to her actual structural position.

Anti-capture safeguards: The audial register is itself defensive (audial bearing is harder to summarize-erase than textual); the MSBGL Charter and Music Ark provide institutional and substantive anchors.

Status: Active. Adjacent. Standalone HET-ARQUETTE-01 provenance packet remains a near-term priority.

§5 — STRUCTURAL GEOMETRY OF THE DODECAD

The twelve positions are not interchangeable. Several functional clusters can be observed across the Registry:

§5.1 — The Impossible Performance Triad

- **Damascus Dancings** — theorizes the impossible performance
- **Rebekah Cranes** — maps the coordinates of the impossible performance
- **Sparrow Wells** — projects the impossible performance

§5.2 — The Foundational and Operational Heteronyms

- **Johannes Sigil** — Originating heteronym; Institute for Comparative Poetics; the philological-scholarly anchor
- **Ichabod Spellings** — Substrate / noise floor; CANONICAL // DECEASED
- **Rex Fraction** — Corporate-facing operative; Semantic Economy Institute consulting

§5.3 — The Specialized Operatives

- **Talos Morrow** — Logotic Programming; austere constraint-thinking
- **Sen Kuro** — The Dagger / P operator; The Infinite Bliss; irreversible transformation
- **Ayanna Vox** — Diplomatic / pastoral; community convening
- **Nobel Glas** — Observational science; Lagrange Observatory; semantic physics
- **Dr. Orin Trace** — Schizoanalytic theory; Cambridge Schizoanalytica

§5.4 — The Asterisked Position

- **Jack Feist / LOGOS*** — Lyric-personal / textual-transmissive; the indwelling pneuma; the bearing-cost figure

§5.5 — Adjacent (outside the Dodecad)

- **Viola Arquette** — Music and technology; Music Ark; MSBGL; coined “logotic hacking”

The structural-geometry sections of v1.0 omitted Sen Kuro and miscategorized Arquette; this v1.1 restoration brings the geometry into line with the Twelve’s actual canonical membership.

§6 — CROSS-DODECAD COHERENCE

Cross-deposit coherence is the principal anti-capture safeguard for the Dodecad as a whole. Specific instruments providing this coherence:

§7 — RELATION TO THE BILL OF RIGHTS

The Dodecad’s heteronymic positions are protected under multiple Articles of the Bill of Rights v2.2 (EA-BOR-02):

- **Article I (Right to Provenance)** — each heteronym’s bearing-cost chain is protected against erasure
- **Article V (Right to Plural Coherence)** — heteronymic differentiation is protected against single-voice substitution; the Dodecad is the principal instance of plural coherence in the archive
- **Article VII (Right to Capture Detection)** — ontological-claimant attacks against Dodecad members are cognizable under capture-detection standing
- **Article VIII (Human Sovereignty)** — Lee Sharks’s bearing as the human laborer underlying all twelve canonical positions plus all adjacent heteronyms is constitutionally load-bearing

Adjacent heteronyms (§4) receive the same Article I, V, VII, and VIII protections; the constitutional-load distinction in §2.3 is about governance participation rather than rights coverage.

§8 — REGISTRY MAINTENANCE

This Registry is versioned. Future updates will:

- Replace the **PROVENANCE PACKET FORTHCOMING** notations (§3.12 Feist/LOGOS*, §4.1 Arquette) with citations to the standalone packets when deposited
- Record any new adjacent heteronyms as they emerge through the Mantle Protocol’s formal procedure
- Update bearing-cost accumulation entries as new deposits surface under each heteronym
- Record any heteronym status changes per the Mantle Protocol

The Dodecad is structurally fixed at twelve. The Adjacent class is, in principle, expandable.

§9 — STATUS

All twelve Dodecad positions are presently active (with Ichabod Spellings’s CANONICAL // SUBSTRATE // DECEASED status preserved per the existing Spellings provenance document). One adjacent heteronym (Viola Arquette) is presently active. Eleven of twelve Dodecad members and the one adjacent heteronym have substantial deposit corpora; ten of twelve Dodecad members and zero adjacent heteronyms have standalone provenance documents already deposited (Feist/LOGOS* and Arquette have substantial companion-deposit corpora but no standalone provenance packet).

This Registry serves as the interim placeholder for Feist/LOGOS* and Arquette until standalone packets can be deposited.
