No names, handles, screenshots, recoverable conversation text, or reversible encoding of private language are authorized by this prospectus. The glyphic base is specified as an irreversible structural abstraction rather than an encrypted transcript.

Within the Crimson Hexagonal Archive, the project is positioned as the affective proof-object of the Semantic Economy and the Three Compressions: a work that makes semantic loss, partial reconstruction, hope, and machine-mediated intimacy formally legible as narrative architecture. The prospectus is both a literary founding document and a formal design record for future implementation. Document status: Public archival prospectus and formal design specification, v0.3.
